We love animals and we eat them. *Requiem for a piece of meat* is a musical and choreographic funeral mass in honour of the animal. Daniel Hellmann's artistic exploration of the body and its instrumentalisation shifts into the area of conflict between humanity and animality, life and death.

ABOUT THE PIECE

Under the direction of Daniel Hellmann, a group of dancers, vocalists, instrumentalists and two pigs have gone through a joint working process that unwinds the traditional order of bodily functions and assignments. Dancing, tripping, groaning and grunting, they transform the stage into a space of interspecies encounters. Who here is animal, human, thing? How free can we be?

Mountains of meat and moving limbs interweave themselves with musical languages from several epochs to form a requiem in seven movements. A commissioned work by the young composer Lukas Huber confronts the historical material with the sound of intestines, the voices of animals and the musicality of their processing. Poetry and objectivity. A farewell to allegedly established categories. A funeral mass in the midst of life.

After **Traumboy**, a documentary solo piece about sex work, the young choreographer, singer and performer Daniel Hellmann pursues his research of a transdisciplinary art dealing with the contemporary body, a sensitive and social body with all his contradictions and paradoxes.

BIOGRAPHIES

3art3 Company - Daniel Hellmann Performer, director, choreographer, singer

Daniel Hellmann (born 1985) is a dance- and theatermaker, singer and performer. He is based in his hometown Zurich as well as in Berlin and studied philosophy, classical singing and theatre / performance in Zurich, Lausanne and Bern. After taking part in several opera productions in Switzerland, Belgium and Germany he founded 3art3 Company in 2012 in order to realize pieces that unite music, dance and theater. For the first 3art3-project K. – a collaboration with the choreographer Quan Bui Ngoc – he won a prize from the Swiss Author Society and received a Cultural Award from the City of Zurich.

Since 2014 he created *Untold* with 3art3 and as a co-production with Les Ballets C de la B, with Matterhorn Produktionen the music-theatre piece *Nach Lampedusa* about the Swiss asylum system and the interactive performances *Full Service* and *THE_SPACE_BETWEEN*.

Hellmann's solo performance *Traumboy* about male prostitution premiered in 2015 as a coproduction with Gessnerallee Zürich and Festspiele Zürich and was invited to Swiss Selection in Avignon 2016. Daniel Hellmann's work has been shown at festivals and theaters in Switzerland, France, Germany, Belgium, Netherlands, Italy, UK, Spain and in the USA. His newest work *Requiem for a piece of meat* (2017), a music-dance-performance about our contradictory relationships to animals, meat and death, has received the June Johnson Dance Prize.

Daniel Hellmann will research for a new project (season 2018-19) in a 6-month residency in San Francisco (USA).

Nacho has played an important role during the rehearsals, as a role model for the professional performers, and he also participated live on stage in the first series of performannees at Gessnerallee Zürich.

novantik project basel

novantik project basel is a young ensemble of singers and musicians with a passion for early and contemporary music.

novantik project basel performs in various combinations of voices and instruments ranging from 2 to 30 people – depending on the requirements of the repertoire: from recitals with piano and voice to concerts with madrigals, from music for chamber choir to oratorios or baroque operas on period instruments. novantik project basel builds bridges between eras and human beings by conveying the joy of playing together – a joy that musicians of all times are connected by. The ensemble consists of professional singers and musicians who are all trained in historically informed musical practice of various epochs: the majority studied at the Schola Cantorum Basiliensis and one of the main strenghts of the ensemble is a common language in their understanding of the music that they interpret. Open to research as well as to experiments, they search for new perspectives on each piece of music they have in front of them, which leads to refreshing artistic outcomes. Each project is seen as an opportunity for creativity as well as for sharing music-related emotions with each other and with the audience.
